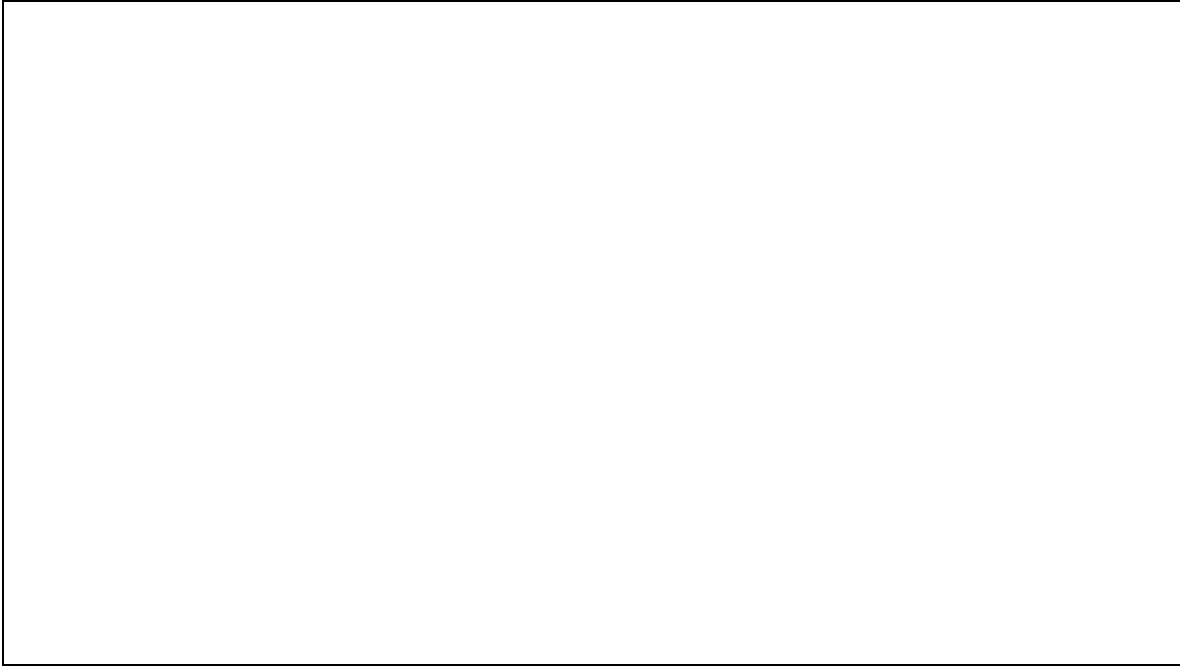

# *Flags and People*

**Part 4. People throughout the world are in some ways different and in other ways the same. The Companion Flag is a reminder of all the ways people are the same. It is a white flag with a stripe of color across the top. It is flown (at all times) below another flag, never by itself. That's why it's called the *Companion Flag*.**

**The stripe at the top of the Companion Flag is any color that appears in the flag flying above it. For example, a Companion Flag displayed below the United States flag will have either a red stripe, or a blue stripe. In the space provided below, create a Companion Flag for the flag you drew in Part 2, above.**
